Born in Qatar in 1952, H.E. Al-Attiyah has more than 30 years of experience in the energy industry and has served in several senior leadership positions within the government of Qatar.

In 1992, H.E. Al-Attiyah was appointed Minister of Energy & Industry and Chairman and Managing Director of Qatar Petroleum, before being entrusted with the additional responsibility of Second Deputy Prime Minister in 2003. Four years later, H.E. was elevated to Deputy Prime Minister, and in 2011 was appointed Chief of the Amiri Diwan. H.E. Al-Attiyah has also served as Chairman of Qatar's Planning Commission, and was elected as Chairman of the United Nations Commission on Sustainable Development in 2006; and the President of 18th Session of UNFCCC Climate Change Conference (COP18/ CMP8), Doha in 2012.

During his illustrious career, Al-Attiyah has been bestowed a number of awards and honours including the Grand Cross in the Order of the Orange Nassau conferred by Her Majesty Queen Beatrix of the Kingdom of Netherlands, and the Grand Cordon Order of the Rising Sun awarded by His Imperial Majesty Emperor of Japan in recognition of his contribution in promoting bilateral relations between Qatar and Japan.

On December 20th 2011, HE Al-Attiyah was also conferred the Necklace of Independence award by HH Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, the Emir of the state of Qatar, for his salutary contribution towards Qatar's commitment to transparency in business and governance and for his efforts towards the progress of the national economy.

Dr. Majid Al-Moneef is an advisor to the Royal Court of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and a member of Saudi Aramco Board of directors. Previously he was the Secretary General and a member of the Supreme Economic Council of Saudi Arabia and served as Saudi Arabia's Governor to OPEC and its representative to the organization's Economic Commission Board. He was a member of the Economic and Energy Committee of the Majlis Ash Shura (Consultative Assembly), the Chairman of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) Energy Team, president of the Arab Energy Forum and of the Saudi Economic Association, and professor of economics at King Saud University in Saudi Arabia.

Dr. Al-Moneef is a member of Saudi Aramco's Board of Directors, the International Advisory Group of King Abdullah Petroleum Studies and Research Center (KAPSARC), the Oxford Energy Policy Club and the Advisory Council of the Emirates Center for Strategic Studies and Research (ECSSR).



Hamad Rashid Al Mohannadi

Mr. Al Mohannadi is a Board Member and Senior Advisor at Qatar Petroleum (QP), as well as a Board Member and Chairman of the Gas Marketing Committee at RasGas Company Limited. He is also an Advisory Board Member of the Bilateral US-Arab Chamber of Commerce and a founding member of the Abdullah bin Hamad Al-Attiyah Foundation for Energy and Sustainable Development. Mr. Al Mohannadi was the Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of RasGas in April 2007-2015 and has been a board member of Ras Laffan Liquefied Natural Gas Company Limited since 1993. Previous roles also include being the General Manager at Qatar Petrochemical Company (QAPCO), the Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of Qatar Petroleum (QP), and a Deputy Vice Chairman of the Board of Industries Qatar (IQ). He was also a member of the Board of Trustees of Qatar University and was appointed by His Highness Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani as Chairman of the Board. Mr. Al Mohannadi was awarded a BA (Hons) degree in Applied Engineering Science by Portland State University, US in 1981.

Claude Mandil served from 2003 to 2007 as Executive Director of the International Energy Agency. This post climaxes his commitment to international cooperation in energy affairs, in parallel with his career as a distinguished French civil servant. Before joining the IEA, Claude was CEO of the Institut Français du Pétrole. Dr. Bassam Fattouh

Dr. Bassam Fattouh is the Director of the Oxford Institute for Energy Studies and Professor at the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London. He specialises in international oil pricing systems, OPEC pricing power, security of Middle Eastern oil supplies, and the dynamics of oil prices and oil price differentials. He has published a variety of articles on oil and gas topics and his publications have appeared in academic and professional journals. Dr. Fattouh served as a member of an independent expert group established to provide recommendations to the 12th International Energy Forum (IEF) Ministerial Meeting for strengthening the architecture of the producer-consumer dialogue through the IEF. He also acts as an adviser to governments and industry, and is a regular speaker at international conferences.



Adnan Z. Amin

As the first Director-General of IRENA, Adnan Z. Amin has led the Agency to become one of the world's fastest-growing international organisations, and established it as the global voice of renewables. With 25 years of experience in international cooperation, Mr. Amin has a proven record as a driving force in advancing the global agenda on sustainable development, environment and energy, and an active player on the world stage.



Margaret McQuaile

Margaret McQuaile was a senior correspondent with Platts in London for many years. She was born and educated in Ireland and embarked on a career in journalism after she moved to London in the late 1970s. Having joined Platts as an oil market reporter in 1983, she covered her first OPEC meeting in Vienna in the summer of 1985. Her work at Platts ranged from fast, real-time coverage of developing news to in-depth analysis of changing supply and demand patterns. Her particular focus, however, has been on OPEC and OPEC member countries. She is a recipient of OPEC's 2015 Award for Journalism and the International Association for Energy Economics 2006 Award for Excellence in Written Journalism. Margaret is now a novelist. In 2013, she spent six months studying novel writing at Faber Academy. Her first novel, What She Never Told Me, was published in 2016 by Quercus, part of the Hachette Group, and her second will be published in October 2017.

GUIDELINES FOR THE SELECTION OF SUCCESSFUL AWARD WINNERS

This is open to an individual with an outstanding record of achievement in the advancement of the international energy industry and/or energy policy, but should not currently be an executive employed by an International Oil Company.

Nominees may come from a variety of backgrounds, including academic, political, technical, industry, business or media fields. A strong candidate will have made an exceptional impact on their field with distinct personal achievements over at least three decades. They should be an inspirational individual, and through their contribution and/or leadership, their work will have reached far beyond their own actions and affected people, companies and/or nations.

Key Criteria for Nominees to Make it On to 5-Person Shortlist in Each Category:

1. Impact

- An outstanding record of accomplishment in their sector over the whole of a career.
- Clear, significant and sustained positive impact in their sector over many decades.
- Demonstrated commitment to further the advancement of the energy industry as a whole, for example through advocacy, stakeholder engagement, international partnership, education, media, and standards development.

2. Leadership & Partnership

- Widely recognized as an outstanding and inspirational figure in their field, with much of the impact attributable to this individual having been brought about through other people, as a result of the candidate's qualities.

3. Innovative and Creative Thinking

- Clear individual contribution to the development of innovative solutions, services or initiatives with tangible benefits.

4. Long-Term Vision

- An exceptional impact on the energy industry with distinct personal achievements for a consistent and prolonged period of engagement.
- Clear vision for the long-term future of energy and its place and role in the world, which drives on-going work and new initiatives.

SELECTION PROCESS

Step 1: A group of internationally renowned energy figures, including former winners of the Al-Attiyah Awards, are invited each year to join the volunteer Selection Committee.

Step 2: The 7-person International Selection Committee and the awards producer submit nominees that meet the above criteria for the six award categories -- Qatar; OPEC; Producer-Consumer Dialogue; Education; Renewable Energy; Journalism -- which delivers a shortlist of five nominees for each category.

Step 3: The 7-person International Selection Committee independently scores every nominee in each of the six Award categories for their performance on each of the above 4 Criteria.

Step 4: The scores of the 7-person Selection Committee are aggregated and the nominees are ranked in accordance with their total points tally.

Step 5: His Excellency Al-Attiyah each year selects one additional outstanding individual to receive an Honorary Lifetime Achievement Award for the Advancement of International Energy Policy & Diplomacy.

Honorary Lifetime Achievement Award for the Advancement of International Energy Policy & Diplomacy

Sir Mark Moody-Stuart

*Chairman, Global Compact Foundation & Vice Chairman, UN Global Compact
Former Chairman Royal Dutch Shell Group*

Mark Moody-Stuart is Chairman of the Global Compact Foundation and Vice Chairman of the UN Global Compact. A director Saudi Aramco (2007-) and on the advisory board of Envision Energy. He was Chairman of the Royal Dutch/Shell Group (1998–2001), of Anglo American plc (2002-2009) and of Hermes Equity Ownership Services (2009-2016). Born in Antigua, after a doctorate in geology in 1966 at Cambridge, he worked for Shell starting as an exploration geologist, living in Holland, Spain, Oman, Brunei, Australia, Nigeria, Turkey and Malaysia, and the UK.

He is Chairman of the Innovative Vector Control Consortium for combating insect borne disease and was Chairman of the Global Business Coalition for HIV/AIDS from 2002-2011. He was a director of HSBC from 2001-2010 and of the International Institute for Sustainable Development 2003-2011. He served on the China Council for International Cooperation on Environment and Development 2003-2011. Honorary Co-Chairman of the International Tax and Investment Center (2011-). Chairman of the FTSE ESG Advisory Committee. He chaired task forces on renewable energy for the G8 and for business for the 2002 World Summit on Sustainable Development in Johannesburg. Board Member of the Global Reporting Initiative 2002-7. President Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine 1997-2008. Member of the UN Secretary General's Advisory Council for the Global Compact 2001-2004. Author of "Responsible Leadership – Lessons from the front line of sustainability and ethics". He was appointed a Knight Commander of St Michael and St George in 2000. Married to Judy with four children.

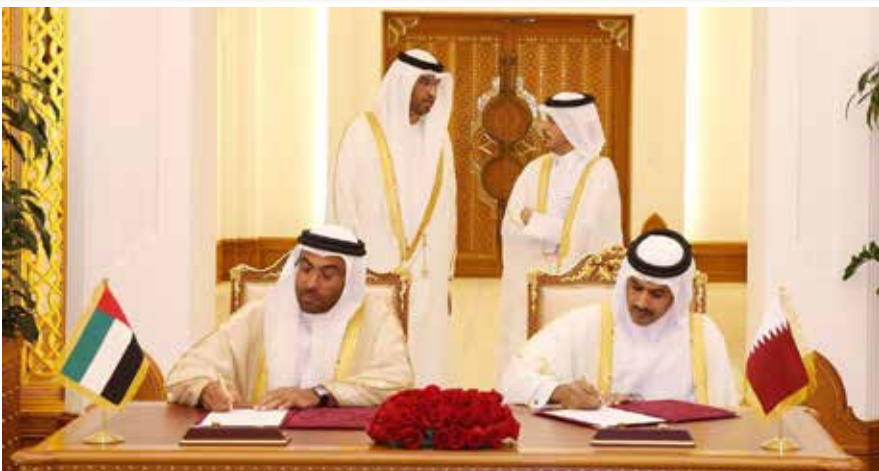


Lifetime Achievement Award for the Advancement of the Qatar Energy Industry



Saad Sherida Al-Kaabi

President & CEO, Qatar Petroleum



Eng. Al-Kaabi joined Qatar Petroleum (QP) in 1986 as a student studying Petroleum & Natural Gas Engineering at Pennsylvania State University (Penn State) in the USA from which he graduated in 1991 with a Bachelor of Science (BSC) degree in Petroleum & Natural Gas Engineering.

Immediately after graduation, he joined QP's Reservoir & Field Development Department, where he progressed through various petroleum engineering, technical, commercial and supervisory positions. He then became the Manager of Gas Development responsible for North Field management and development, where he and his team played a key role in the rapid launch of many mega gas projects based on the most up-to-date technologies, which were

implemented in record time, making a major contribution towards Qatar's rapid rise to becoming the LNG and GTL capital of the world; as well as several large gas pipeline projects domestically and for export.

From 2006 until this appointment, Eng. Al-Kaabi was the Director of QP's Oil & Gas Ventures Directorate, where he was overseeing all of Qatar's oil and gas fields' developments as well as all the exploration activities in Qatar.

In September 2014, Mr. Al-Kaabi was appointed as QP's Managing Director. He later became (in November 2014) the President and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) as part of major re-organization of Qatar Petroleum.

Noé Van Hulst

Ambassador of the Netherlands to the OECD & Chairman, IEA Governing Board



Ambassador Noé Van Hulst took up his duties as Permanent Representative of the Netherlands to the OECD and the IEA on 16 September 2013.

Mr. Van Hulst was born on 25 September 1956 in the Netherlands. He holds a Master's Degree and a Ph.D. in Economics from the Free University of Amsterdam. He also took several management courses including media training and a Krauthammer International management course in human resources and change management.

Mr. Van Hulst started his career in 1980 as a Researcher in the Department of Micro-economics at the Free University in Amsterdam. In 1985, he was appointed Senior Economist and Deputy Head of the Macroeconomic Policy Department of the Social and Economic Council (SER) in the Netherlands. Mr. van Hulst then held several important positions within the Ministry of Economic

Affairs: from 1988 to 1991, he was Head of the Longer-Term Studies Group within the Directorate for Technology Policy; from 1991 to 1994, he became Deputy Director for Technology Policy; from 1994 to 1997, he was Director for Competition & Fair Trading and Deputy Director-General of Economic Structure from 1997; finally from 1999 to 2003, he was Director-General for Energy. In 2003, Mr. van Hulst joined the International Energy Agency (IEA) in Paris as Director for Long-Term Co-operation and Policy Analysis (LTO) until 2007. From 2008 to 2011, he held the position of Secretary-General of the International Energy Forum (IEF) in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. Mr. van Hulst is a member of the Beijing Energy Club and the Curatorium of VNO/NCW (Dutch employers association). He is also co-Chair of the OECD Informal Reflection Group on China. From January 2012 until his nomination as Permanent Representative of the Netherlands to the OECD, Ambassador Noé van Hulst was Director of the Energy Academy Europe in Groningen.

Suleiman Jasir Al-Herbish

Director-General, OPEC Fund for International Development (OFID)

Suleiman Jasir Al-Herbish, a Saudi national, has been the Director-General and Chief Executive Officer of the OPEC Fund for International Development (OFID) since November 2003. Al-Herbish is a long-time supporter of people-centered development, a principle he has kept at the heart of OFID throughout his stewardship. He has been especially vocal on the issue of energy poverty eradication, a cause he has championed tirelessly at the highest level and one that forms the central pillar of OFID's strategic plan.

Since assuming office, Al-Herbish has led numerous initiatives to make OFID's work more relevant and efficient, including the broadening of financing mechanisms and the conclusion of partnership agreements with a large number of bilateral and multilateral partners.

Al-Herbish has also driven institutional change at OFID, particularly in the areas of human resource development and corporate communications, the latter with a view to increasing visibility for OFID in both its Partner and Member Countries as well as within the wider development community.

As a member of the high-level group formed by United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki Moon to guide the Sustainable Energy for All (SE4ALL) initiative, Al-Herbish helped to secure a place for universal energy access, as SDG7, in the 2030 Global Development Agenda.

Al-Herbish is a member of the Advisory Board of SE4ALL, which is co-chaired by the UN Secretary General and the World Bank President. OFID is also a member of the Energy Access Sub Committee for SE4All.

Al-Herbish holds a BA in Economics and Political Science from the University of Cairo and an MA in Economics from Trinity University, San Antonio, Texas.

Prior to his appointment at OFID, he served for 13 years as the Governor of Saudi Arabia at OPEC. During his tenure at the Ministry of Petroleum, he also chaired companies in partnership with Schlumberger and Chevron, as well as the National Shipping Company of Saudi Arabia, which is a joint stock. He is currently in his third term of office at OFID, having been re-elected unanimously by the institution's highest authority, the Ministerial Council, in June 2013.

Lifetime Achievement Award for the Advancement of Education for Future Energy Leaders

Ali Aissaoui

*Senior Oxford Visiting Research Fellow & Independent Energy Consultant,
Oxford Institute for Energy Studies*

Having retired from a long career, Ali Aissaoui has recently returned to the Oxford Institute for Energy Studies as a senior visiting research fellow.

After serving at energy policy level in Algeria, including representing the country on the OPEC board of governors, Ali seized on the opportunity offered to him by the late Robert Mabro, in the mid-1990s, to join the Institute and conceptualise his experience. The books he authored or contributed to during that period provide key insights on how history, economic policy and international relations combine to shape the political economy of oil and gas.

Furthermore, during his last full-time position, working for a Saudi-based regional multilateral energy bank, as its head of research, Ali has developed original approaches to decision-making. These have included a consistent mapping of the energy investment climates as well as the systematic scanning of the risks and financeability of large-scale energy projects across the Arab world.

In addition to informing government and corporate policies, Ali has regularly shared his research findings through publications and put them to the test, whenever involved as a speaker, discussant or peer reviewer.

Despite his time-consuming work, Ali has always managed to make room for post-graduate students in the field of energy, guiding them through the painstaking process of researching and writing their dissertations. This has included helping identify potential research questions, giving advice on how to gain access to relevant data, as well as providing critical comments and feedback on core arguments.

Finally, worth mentioning is Ali's involvement in major professional societies. He is indeed a member of the Oxford Energy Policy Club, the Paris Energy Club, and the Arab Energy Club. Regular attendance to their meetings allowed him to interact with fellow international experts and debate the significance of global trends and their policy and business implications.

John Deferios

Emerging Markets Editor/Anchor, CNNMoney

John Deferios is the CNNMoney Emerging Markets Editor. Based in the network's Abu Dhabi bureau since 2011 his reporting focuses on the top business stories from emerging economies.

In addition to his daily reporting for CNN's main business programming, John hosts 'CNN Marketplace Middle East', a business programme featuring in-depth analysis and top newsmakers from across the Middle East. John also hosts "One Square Meter" the first television and digital platform to explore world class property developments in emerging markets.

Deferios has more than two decades of financial news and current affairs experience covering some of the landmarks events during that period including the Gulf War, the fall of the Berlin Wall, the World Trade Centre bombings and G8/G20 summits from his postings in London, Washington, New York, Los Angeles, Rome and the Middle East.

Deferios has covered the energy sector for more than a quarter century,

including key OPEC meetings since 1990. He has gone into oil and gas fields the world over, including the North Slope of Alaska, Central Asia and throughout the Middle East from his current base in Abu Dhabi. He has secured a number of exclusive interviews at key events and serves as chairman of the leading energy events including: The OPEC Seminar, World Energy Congress, World Economic Forum, Gulf Intelligence Forum and the Atlantic Council Energy Forum.

He is a World Economic Forum media leader and member of the Global Agenda Council on the Arab World and has served as Chairman of the Business Week Leadership Forums in London, Beijing and New York, the World Islamic Economic Forum amongst others.

Deferios started at CNN in New York as correspondent on 'Moneyline with Lou Dobbs', anchored CNN's 'World Business Today' and the top rated U.S. morning business program 'Ahead of the Curve'.

Former President and CEO, Canadian Energy Research Institute (CERI)

Mr. Masri retired in 2010 as President and CEO of the Canadian Energy Research Institute (CERI), in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, where he also served as member of the Board of Directors of CERI and the Executive Committee of the Board. At CERI, Mr. Masri built and directed a cohesive Executive Management Team of three Vice Presidents, Program Managers and Senior Research Directors and oversaw the organization's four lines of business. Developed and implemented a sustainable new business model for CERI in response to vulnerability to market risk and uncertainty. Represented Canada's energy perspective in North America and globally Prior to becoming President, he served as Vice President, Research directing an interdisciplinary team in developing and successfully completing major research projects on energy, economics and the environment.

Prior to joining CERI, Mr. Masri had a long and distinguished career with the California Energy Commission (CEC), where he joined the Commission at the entry beginning in 1976. He progressed through many positions of increasing

levels of responsibility and retired from the CEC in 2005 as Deputy Executive Director responsible for R&D and Technology Division.

Mr. Masri's landmark achievement at the CEC was building and leading a team of staff experts and special consultants in the design and implementation of a \$1.9 billion funding program to transition independently owned renewable power projects to competitive markets. The resulting innovative program, implemented beginning in 1998, earned national and international recognition and awards. The program design was market based and comprehensive covering the supply and demand sides of the market. Mr. Masri twice received the Commission's Superior Accomplishment Award.

Mr. Masri served as a member of the King Abdullah Petroleum Studies and Research Center international Advisory Council and is currently a member of International Advisory Board of the Asia Pacific Energy Research Center in Tokyo, Japan.
